**Scope and Content:** Once held in the private library of Andrij Makuch (1956, Lethbridge, AB—2019, Toronto, ON). A student and community activist as a youth, and a scholar of Ukrainian-Canadian history, Makuch worked for over thirty years at the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies in a variety of roles, including editor of the *Encyclopedia of Ukraine*; senior editor of the *Internet Encyclopedia of Ukraine*; associate director of research and publications of the Institute’s Holodomor Research and Education Consortium; and research coordinator of the Kule Ukrainian Canadian Studies Centre. Makuch had a lifelong interest in Ukrainian Canadiana and collected print and manuscript sources and ephemeral material relating to the Ukrainian experience in Canada.

**Source of Acquisition:** Andrij Makuch’s daughter Larisa Makuch, donated the photographs and a small number of books (catalogued for Robarts and/or added the John Luczkiw Collection of Ukrainian Canadiana at Fisher) on 15 March 2019.

**Terms of Access:** Available for faculty, students, and researchers engaged in scholarly projects.
