Scope and Content: Once held in the private library of Andrij Makuch (1956, Lethbridge, AB—2019, Toronto, ON). A student and community activist as a youth, and a scholar of Ukrainian-Canadian history, Makuch worked for over thirty years at the Canadian Institute of Ukrainian Studies in a variety of roles, including editor of the *Encyclopedia of Ukraine*; senior editor of the *Internet Encyclopedia of Ukraine*; associate director of research and publications of the Institute's Holodomor Research and Education Consortium; and research coordinator of the Kule Ukrainian Canadian Studies Centre. Makuch had a lifelong interest in Ukrainian Canadiana and collected print and manuscript sources and ephemeral material relating to the Ukrainian experience in Canada.
