Biographical notes

Joshua Price Brown, Esq. (1805-1904)

Joshua Brown was born and educated in Manchester, England on 7 April 1805. Brown was a police superintendent and amateur scientist in Stockport and Manchester. In 1841, he briefly moved to New York to look for employment with the police service before travelling back to Manchester. In 1854, Brown wrote *System of the Universe*, a text based on his understanding of the principles and internal laws of the earth's matter. He positioned his viewpoint in opposition to the Newtonian philosophy of how motion affects matter¹. He married Sarah Price Brown in 1833 and his family, including five sons and four daughters, emigrated to Canada in 1855. Once here, they settled in Simcoe County, Ontario. Brown was part of Lymedoch Lyceum, a debating society in Ontario. He died in 1904.

Dr. John Price Brown (1844-1938)

John Price Brown was a founder and governor of the Toronto Western Hospital, a short story writer and, after losing his sight around 1918, a writer of historical novels. Brown was born in Manchester, England on 30 March 1844 and with his family, emigrated to Canada (Simcoe County, Ontario) in 1855 where they had a farm. He graduated with a Bachelor of Medicine (MB) from the University of Toronto in 1868 and was the first medical student to receive two gold medals in Surgery and Medicine when he graduated with Doctor of Medicine (MD) in 1869. After postgraduate work at Edinburgh University (F.R.C.P), he settled in Galt, Ontario, then moved to Toronto in 1889 to specialize in nose and throat surgery. It was within this medical specialty that he pioneered new surgical techniques. Brown was a fellow of the American Laryngological Association and the American Laryngological Rhinological and Otological Society. Brown was married twice: first to Agnes Cranston Brown (1851-1881, having three sons together) and then to Florence Jennings. He died in Toronto on 3 April 1938.

Newton Harcourt Brown (1874-1946)

Newton Harcourt Brown, second son of John Price Brown, was born in Galt, Ontario in 1874. He ran a company that sold pharmaceutical and physicians' supplies, was a collector of botanical specimens, and an amateur oil landscape painter. Brown graduated from the Ontario College of Pharmacy and, when it joined the University of Toronto, he passed the Bachelor of Pharmacy exam to earn his PhmB in 1895. He married Grace Amanda Young, who attended University College between 1897 and 1898. They had four sons and a daughter: Newton Price Harcourt, Agnes Elizabeth, Graham Egerton, Robert Young, and John Quentin Harcourt. Young died in 1934. Brown then married Grace Amy Rankin Brown in 1936. Brown was a charter member and

served on the first Executive of the Canadian Club. Brown lived in Richmond Hill. He died on 11 November 1946.

Harcourt Brown (1900-1990)

(Newton Price) Harcourt Brown was born in Toronto on May 30, 1900, and was the eldest son of Newton Harcourt Brown. At the University of Toronto, Harcourt Brown was a Curator of the Hart House Library and Dramatic Editor of the *Varsity*. He received his Bachelor of Arts (UC, 1925) and Master of Arts (1926) with a focus on Modern Languages. Between 1926 and 1929, Brown taught at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. Harcourt Brown married Dorothy Elizabeth Stacey in 1927 (Dorothy graduated from University College in 1923). He was appointed as University Scholar at Columbia University in 1930-1931 and obtained a PhD in Philosophy from the institution in 1934. He published his book, *Scientific Organization in Seventeenth Century France* (1935), for which he travelled to various libraries and archives across France, Italy, and Norway. He would later found University College's Harcourt Brown Travel Fellowship to allow undergraduate and graduate students to travel to archives and libraries internationally in order to encourage access to archival materials for student research. Brown went on to teach as a professor emeritus of French Language and Literature at Brown University, Providence, Rhode Island from 1937-1969. He was also the co-founder and associate editor of *The Annals of Science* (1935-1974). Brown's daughter Jennifer Brown was born in 1940. Brown retired in 1973 and moved to Parry Sound, Ontario. Professor Brown died in Winnipeg on November 17, 1990.

Egerton Brown (1904-1998)

(Graham) Egerton Brown was the youngest son of Newtown Harcourt Brown. At the University of Toronto, Brown was the President of the University College Literary and Athletic Society. He received a BA in Political Science from the University of Toronto in 1926. Egerton Brown married Hazel Kingsworthy in 1927. He worked for Sun Life Assurance Company in Montreal for many years beginning as a clerk in 1921 (which he left to attend University of Toronto), returning in 1925, and eventually became Senior Vice-President in 1963. He was also a Fellow and President of the Life Insurance Institute of Canada. He died in 1998.

Elizabeth Brown (1902-1990)

(Agnes) Elizabeth Brown, the daughter of Newton Harcourt Brown, received a BA from the University of Toronto in 1928 (she was elected vice-president of the 2T8 University College class) and a MA in Personnel and Guidance from Columbia University in 1939. Prior to WWII, she worked for the department stores, Simpson's and Eatons, and in New York, at Greenwich House. During the war, Elizabeth Brown initiated a program to recruit women into industries for the federal Department of Labour. Brown was the Chief of Mission for the UN Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) in Palestine (1945-

1947). She later served as the Regional Officer for the National League of Nursing. When in Germany, she served as Director of Repatriation for the US zone for the International Refugee Organization (IRO) (1948-1952). Brown later became Director of Foster Parents Plan (1963-1969) in Ho Chi Ming City, Vietnam, formerly known as Saigon. She helped establish a Foster Parents Plan in Australia (1971-1972) before retiring. The Elizabeth Brown Travel Award was established in her name to support University College students provide humanitarian aid internationally. Brown died in 1990.

Scope and content

1846-2004

3.13m of textual records (10 boxes), photographic material, video and artifacts

This fonds consists of materials from 15 different family members and is arranged in series based on the size of the materials from each member (with six family members contributing to most of this fonds). There are 8 series overall (with series 7 consisting of additional family members and series 8 as the photography series). Each series within this fonds predominantly consists of correspondence between family members, legal documents, financial records, articles, diaries, genealogical research, and analog photographs, and a video. This fonds also consists of objects such as medals, ribbons, and an engraved plate.

Custodial history: Harcourt Brown, acting as the genealogist of the family, collected many of the records included in accessions that make up this fonds. Later, other members of the family with additional records donated these to the archives.

Arrangement: Materials within this fonds include multiple accessions and was described under a single arrangement in 2022. The series primarily represents materials related to specific family members. See specific series for additional arrangement details.

Series 1: Joshua Brown and Sarah [Price] Brown

1841-1905, 1967-1987

0.07m of textual records

This series contains scanned documents of Joshua Brown and Sarah [Price] Brown. It mainly details Joshua Brown's career as a policeman/police superintendent in Stockport and Manchester. Included in the files are Joshua Brown's writings, such as his account as a policeman in "Beating the Bounds" later published by Harcourt Brown, scans of documents such as marriage certificates, family tree, census from the Archives of Ontario, and correspondence from Harcourt Brown (or HB as he is labelled on the files) about his family history/genealogy research.

Note: Material in this series contains some scanned copies of documents from the Archives of Ontario. They include Harcourt Brown's notes (HB), which were used in his genealogical research project.

Arrangement: The files have been arranged according to the chronological and geographical location of Joshua Brown and family (beginning in Stockport, then Manchester, New York, Manchester again then Canada). The relationship between HB's research notes and the documents they are about is maintained by using scanned copies.

Series 2: John Price Brown and Florence Jennings Price Brown

1844-1938, 1983-1987

0.15m of textual records, photographic material, multiple media

This series contains files from Dr. John Price Brown and his second wife, Florence Jennings Price Brown. Included is correspondence, articles, and family and legal documents. Files from B2022-0008 contain more extensive documentation of John Price Brown's family life, his novels, university records, property deeds and his will. A framed charcoal portrait of John Price Brown, drawn by Newton Harcourt Brown, is included. Florence Jennings Price Brown's Birthday Book is included as well as Harcourt Brown's research into Florence Jennings Price Brown, John Price Brown and their friend Dr. Shurley in Detroit with scans of their correspondence as well as Harcourt Brown's research notes/correspondence.

Note: Items in each folder that are dated from 1983 to 1987 are the research notes written by Harcourt Brown and scattered through most of John Price Brown's files. In particular, Harcourt Brown mentions using the Birthday Book as a research tool in the Detroit research notes.

Series 3: Newton Harcourt Brown

1892-1947

0.13m of textual records, artifact, and photographic material

This series contains material documenting the life and work of Newton Harcourt Brown in addition to some records related specifically to his wife, Grace Amanda Young. Documents include early handwritten correspondence with Brown's aunts and brother, later handwritten/typewritten correspondence with his son Harcourt Brown (with a few letters for Quentin Brown (his other son) and poetry he wrote in 1893-1895. Legal, medical and estate records are also included. Brown's professional life and career as a pharmacist is reflected in the business records for Newton Harcourt Brown Pharmaceutical Products. The series also includes an engraved plate.

1908-2001

0.07m textual record and photographs

This series primarily consists of correspondence written to Egerton Brown from his family and friends. Regular correspondents include his grandfather, John Price Brown, his mother, Grace Young, his wife, Hazel Brown, his father, Newton Price Brown, and his older brother, Harcourt Brown. Also included are Egerton's career documents, notes from Harcourt Brown, and photographs of the family.

Series 5: [Newton Price] Harcourt Brown

1913-1987, 2001

0.86m of textual records and photographic material

This series contains documents covering Harcourt Brown's writing in a variety of publications and across subject matter, correspondence with family members and colleagues, genealogical research, financial documentation, and course notes from his time in university.

His research and writing from his university years focused on philosophy (with a sub-series focusing on George Sidney Brett, a professor of Philosophy), plays/poetry (with sub-series for the Hart House Theatre and Louis Alexander McKay), and French. Many of these articles were published in *Patches* (University of Toronto's short-lived undergrad magazine), *The Varsity* (he had a column on plays), and as individual reviews. In the Hart House sub-series, some playbills credit Harcourt Brown and his wife Dorothy Stacey as actors, with his autograph on some playbills.

Harcourt Brown later wrote articles focused on Canadian and French history topics (most in English, some in French), philosophy, research trips in Europe, and various historical figures. Harcourt Brown, with his sister, Elizabeth Brown, and brothers, Quentin Brown and Robert Brown, authored a book titled, *The Army's Mister Brown*. The volume details the WWII wartime experiences of Robert and Quentin Brown and Elizabeth Brown's post-war UNHRR missions to Jerusalem and the surrounding areas. Harcourt conducted genealogical research into the Brown family history, for example he helped edit the pamphlet, *Beating the Bounds*.

The Correspondence sub-series includes material sent to and received from Elizabeth Brown, Newton Harcourt Brown, John Price Brown, and other family members and colleagues. It also contains financial records and two books.

Earlier accessions consist of photographs of Harcourt Brown in the Modern Language Club 1920-1921, Varsity Staff 1921-1922, and the participant list from the Corning Conference 1951. Other photographs are in the Photograph series. His financial and travel documents are included in the Personal and Biographical sub-series.

Note: Included in many of the files of original documents are associated scans reflecting Brown's research process. Similarly, HB's notes are also scattered through files in other series as he was one of the primary family historians. These have been noted when identified or especially prevalent in the file headings of the other series.

Series 6: Elizabeth Brown

1918-1986

0.73m of textual records, artifacts, photographic material, and video

This series consists of Elizabeth Brown's professional and personal files. Files within this series include correspondence to family members including Egerton Brown, Harcourt Brown, Dorothy Brown, and Jennifer Brown. Elizabeth Brown, Quentin Brown and Robert Young Brown all contributed their journal entries/correspondence for the "The Army's Mister Brown" a book of their family wartime experiences edited by Harcourt Brown. Elizabeth Brown's experiences with the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) in Jerusalem and Palestine is discussed in this book and in her correspondence files.

Documentation also covers Elizabeth Brown's work and experiences with the UNRRA, the International Refugee Organization, the American Red Cross, and the Foster Parents' Plan. These experiences were noted in Elizabeth's professional notes, transcripts, and her "Middle East Diary". Drafts of her unpublished autobiography similarly detail her career and personal life. Also included are photographs and a video documenting her career and travel, photographs of herself, her family, and her friends, a VHS tape, a box of mementos, and several medals earned for her work with the UNRRA.

Note: This series is composed of two different accessions, one of which was transferred from the University of Manitoba Archives to UTARMS in 2022. File titles include the original University of Manitoba numbering scheme (for example: MSS 336 A 11-17 11-12, MSS 336 A 11-17 13-14).

Arrangement: Material in B2022-0009/001 and B2022-0009/002 follows the chronological order in which it was transferred to us. B2022-0008 maintains the imposed order it was given at The University of Manitoba, from where it was transferred to UTARMS.

Series 7: Additional family members

1875-2006

0.10m of textual records and photographic material

Series contains documentation of seven additional Brown family members, including:

- William Graham Brown (1872-1920): John Price Brown's eldest son, graduated from the University of Toronto in approximately 1893. He died in an automobile crash in 1920.
- Frank Erichsen Brown: Newton Harcourt Brown's youngest brother, born 1878
- Robert Y. Brown: Newton Harcourt Brown's second son, born 1906. He was in the U.S. Air Force Ground Reconnaissance in 1943; after the war, he worked in advertising.
- John Price Erichsen Brown: Frank Erichsen Brown's son, born 1906
- Isabel Lebourdais (Erichsen-Brown): Frank Erichsen Brown's oldest daughter, born 1909
- Frances Erichsen Brown: Frank Erichsen Brown's youngest daughter, born 1917
- Helen Allen Stacey: Charles Perry Stacey's second wife, connected to the Brown family as the sister-in-law to Dorothy Stacey (Harcourt Brown's wife), born 1907

This series primarily consists of correspondence between various family members covering a range of periods and topics, for example WWII and letters from Ho Chi Minh City.

Arrangement: Files are arranged by family member, then follow in chronological order.

Series 8: Brown Family Photographs

1880-1989

0.2m of photographic material

The series contains photographs of various members of the Brown family. Photos include formal portraits of family members at various ages, group photographs, images taken on holidays, graduation photographs, and snapshots of friends. Also included in this collection are photographs of previous Brown residences, photographs from work (in the cases of Harcourt and Elizabeth Brown) and a photo album made by Florence Jennings Price Brown in 1905-1913. Most of the photographs are prints, but negatives and photographic slides from Harcourt Brown are also included. These photographs are predominantly from two periods: between 1880-1910 and 1921-1965.

Note: Some photographs may be fragile, please ask an archivist for assistance.
