## Biographical Note:

Herbert Abraham Clark, and his four children, William H. D., Harriet A. L., Martha (Mattie) and E. Ritchie all graduated from the University of Toronto. Herbert A. Clark was born in 1872 Scarborough, the son of James and Martha Ann Davis Clark. He received his early education at schools in Markham and St. Catharines. He enrolled in the University of Toronto studying history and economics in 1892 and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts (University College) degree in 1895. Following his graduation, he studied law at Osgoode Hall Law School and was called to the bar in 1898. He practiced law for 45 years in Toronto and was a partner in the firm of Mulock, Milliken, Clark and Redman. He continued to serve the University of Toronto as a member of the executive committee of the University College Alumni Association, and as a member of the Senate of the University. He died in 1943.

William H. D. Clark graduated with a Bachelor of Applied Science from the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering in 1924. He became a noted engineer and an authority on power plants. He joined Combustion Engineering-Superheater Ltd. In Montreal as head of the service and erection department. He rose to become chief engineer in 1938, president of the company in 1958 and finally chairman of the board in 1968. He died in 1970.

Harriet A. L. Clark and her sister Mattie both graduated with Bachelor of Arts degrees in 1934 from University College. Harriet studied law in the 1940s at Osgoode Hall Law School, and Mattie continued graduate studies at the University of Toronto, receiving a Master of Arts degree in Canadian History in 1937. Mattie later taught at Branksome Hall girl's school, Tilbury High School and Danforth Technical School. Harriet died in 1992 and Mattie Clark died in 1996.

# Scope and content:

This accession contains student course materials for two generations of the Clark Family who attended the University of Toronto between 1892 and 1937 and Osgoode Hall Law School. It is arranged into four sous fonds: Sous Fonds 1: Herbert A. Clark, Sous fonds 2 William H. D. Clark, Sous Fonds 3 Martha Maud Isabel (Mattie) Clark, and Sous Fonds IV: Harriet Anna Laura Clark.

The Herbert A. Clark sous fonds contains course notes for undergraduate studies in history, law and political science, as well as for law courses taken at Osgoode Hall Law School and for studies at the law firm of Mulock, Miller, Crowther and Montgomery for the late nineteenth century. The sous fonds of three of his four children document their varied academic interests: William H. D. Clark studied engineering, Mattie Clark studied English and history, and Harriet studied home economics and later, followed in her father's footsteps to study law. These sous fonds contain mainly course notes of lectures and readings, laboratory reports for engineering exercises, examinations and some correspondence.

This series consists of predominantly course notes taken as an undergraduate at the University of Toronto where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1895. Courses include history (Canadian, medieval, etc), political science, constitutional history, economics, Roman law, international law, and contracts. Also included are manuscripts of essays prepared for these courses. File (04) consists of course notebooks, which also include a personal diary for the academic year 1892-1893. Notebooks compiled during his high school education in Markham and St. Catherines are in File (01).

Following his graduation from the University of Toronto, H.A. Clark studied law at Osgoode Hall Law School and read law with Mulock, Miller, Crowther & Montgomery. He was called to the bar in 1898. This series contains course notebooks arranged alphabetically by subject. Subjects include commercial and criminal law, constitutional law, contracts, equity, evidence, personal property, real property, statutes, and torts. Also included is a personal diary (1897), and copies of exams.
