## Biographical Note

David Rayside (1947 - ) is a Political Science professor and former Vice-Principal of University College, University of Toronto. Professor Rayside is best known for his contributions to scholarship on race, ethnicity, gender, class and sexuality.

A native of Montreal, Prof. Rayside obtained his B.A. Honours in Political Science from Carleton University in 1969. He pursued graduate studies at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, receiving his A.M. in 1971 and his Ph.D. in 1976. While completing his doctorate, Prof. Rayside was appointed Assistant Professor of Political Science at the University of Toronto in 1974. He then became Associate Professor in 1979 and full Professor in 1993. In this capacity, Prof. Rayside has taught graduate and undergraduate courses on Canadian politics, Western European politics, gender politics, as well as politics and religion. He was instrumental in developing a course on sexual diversity. In 1980, he spent a year at Harvard University as a Research Associate at the Centre for European Studies. He held positions on many thesis committees both internal and external to the University of Toronto.

Throughout his career, Prof. Rayside has held numerous administrative positions at the University of Toronto. These include Chair of the European Studies Committee, Centre for International Studies 1976-79 and 1980-81 as well as Coordinator of the Canadian Studies Program 1982-86. Between 1993 and 1997, he was the Vice-Principal of University College. In this position, he was responsible for various University College programmes such as Canadian Studies, Drama and Peace and Conflict Studies. During his tenure, he was instrumental in coordinating the Sexual Studies Caucus set up in 1993 to address curricular focus on gay and lesbian issues. Since 1998 he has been active in various capacities on the Advisory Committee for the Sexual Diversity Studies Program. More recently he has been Graduate Director and Associate Chair of the Department of Political Science and Director of the Mark S. Bonham Centre for Sexual Diversity Studies.

In addition to the above noted academic appointments, Prof. Rayside has served on various committees especially for the Department of Political Science and University College. Many of his roles have been as an advocate for sexual diversity and equity rights. Below is a list of only a few committees in which he took a leadership role: Ad Hoc Committee on the Status of Women (1985-87); Sexual Harassment Hearing Panel (1988-92); Men's Forum (1989-94); Committee on Homophobia (1989-94); Teach In-Committee (1990), Ad Hoc Committee on Campus Violence (1991); Co-chair of the Positive Space Campaign (1995-2000). In addition, he was a key organizer to both the Bent on Change Conference (2000) and the Sexual Diversities Studies Conference (2003).

Prof. Rayside has also been involved in off-campus social activism at the federal, provincial and municipal levels. He was a collective member and defender of the gay magazine, *The Body Politic*. He also served on The Right to Privacy Committee, the Citizens Independent Review of Police Activities, and the Bill 7 Coalition. Further, 1991-1994, Prof. Rayside was party to Rayside v. Disero, a legal challenge to the election of Toronto City Councillor, Betty Disero, on the grounds that she violated election spending limits.

Prof. Rayside has published countless papers, articles and reports on topics ranging from federalism and party politics early in his career to race, ethnicity, gender and sexuality in the latter part of his career. Most notably, he is the author of four books:

*Alexandria: A Small Town in Modern Times* (Montreal: McGill-Queen's University Press, 1991)

*On the Fringe: Gays and Lesbians in Politics* (Ithaca: Cornell University Press, 1998)

*Queer Inclusions, Continental Divisions: Public Recognition of Sexual Diversity in Canada and the United States* (Toronto: University of Toronto Press, March 2008)

*Equity, Diversity and Canadian Labour*, edited by Gerald Hunt and David Rayside (University of Toronto Press, 2007). Rayside is unique among academics in the use of oral history to support and research his topics. A great extent of his research are interviews, many of which are preserved in this fonds.

Prof. Rayside has won many awards throughout his career. His most recent award in 2009, the Terry Buckland Award for Diversity and Equity in Education from the University of Toronto, recognized his contribution to the study of diversity and equity issues. His research has been supported by substantive grants from the Social Sciences & Humanities Research Council, the Wellesley Health Foundation and the Canadian Federation for the Humanities and Social Sciences. Prof. Rayside continues to teach in the Department of Political Science at the University of Toronto.

Records in this fonds document most aspects of Prof. Rayside's career as an administrator, activist and academic. Series 1 (Biographical) and 2 (Correspondence) give a good overview of his career and the professional correspondence in Series 2 relate to or complete most other series in the fonds. Correspondence can also be found in all other series.

His role as an adept administrator is documented not only in Series 3 (University of Toronto Administration) but also in the records found in Series 4 (Advocacy) and Series 5 (Professional Associations) where his leadership and involvement on committees is evident. Prof. Rayside's academic interests coincided with his political activism and this is well documented in Series 4 (Advocacy) seen in reference to records in Series 7 (Books) and Series 8 (Articles, Papers and Talks) that extensively document his research and writing. Finally his roles as a teacher and mentor are well documented in Series 6 (Letters of Recommendations and Evaluations) and in Series 9 (Teaching).

B2008-0023 consists of resumes, short biographical notes and activity reports documenting Prof. Rayside.

B2013-0015 consists of records from Prof. Rayside's time as a university student, with most material documenting his undergraduate degree at Carleton University. This series contains correspondence, notes, drafts, submitted essays, press clippings, photographs and application forms documenting both his academic work and his extra-curricular activities including student council, the Political Science Student Union, the Senate Committee on Undergraduate Teaching and Learning and his work on the student residence constitution. Files are arranged chronologically by degree, and by activity within each degree, with academic coursework at the front and extra-curricular activities at the back. There is one file at the beginning of the series containing souvenirs unrelated to his early education.

It documents various academic and political issues in which Prof. Rayside was involved. Much of the correspondence in this fonds relates specifically to documentation in other series.

## Series 3 University Administration

1976-2017 1.41 m of textual records

This series documents Prof. Rayside's varied administrative positions. Files contain original correspondence and e-mails, notes, reports, minutes of meetings, and in specific cases conference programs and posters.

Records for this series found in B1998-0029 document mainly conferences organized by Prof. Rayside in his capacity as a university administrator for both the Canadian Studies Committee (1982-1984) and the European Studies Committee of the International Studies Committee (1976-1985). These include : *The Individual and the State* (1979), *Small Town in Modern Times*,(1983), *1984 in Canada: Authority, Conformity and the Policing of Citizens*" (1983) *The Sharon Temple and the Children of Peace*"(1984), and *Between Ourselves: Women's Experiences at the University of Toronto*, (1985).

Records for this series found in B2008-0023 document his role on several other committees including the Women's Study Committee, Committee to establish the Equity Studies Program, New College, Vice Provost, Students Advisory Search Committee (2002), Graduate Affairs Committee, as well as several smaller committees and advisory roles. There are also three files related to his position as Vice Principal of University College.

The records for this series found in B2013-0015 document Professor Rayside's course evaluation activities, conference organizing activities, and activities he would have performed as Acting Principal and Graduate Director including dealing with a teaching assistant strike, staffing the Political Science Department, and evaluating the graduate program in Political Science. These records also document his participation in the Diversity Working Group, Teaching Load Committee, and Principal's Search Committee, among others. There is also a large amount of material related to creating community relations newsletters for the Department of Political Science and a collection of posters documenting conferences Prof. Rayside helped organize including : *The Individual and the State* (1979), *Small Town in Modern Times*,(1983), *1984 in Canada: Authority, Conformity and the Policing of Citizens*" (1983) *The Sharon Temple and the Children of Peace*"(1984), and *Between Ourselves: Women's Experiences at the University of Toronto*, (1985). These files are arranged chronologically.

Records in accession B2017-0024 document Professor Rayside's on-going involvement in the Mark S. Bonham Centre for Sexual Diversity Studies for the time period after he was director. Included are various committee files relating to public relations, curriculum and program development, budget and fundraising. There are several files documenting Raysides involvement in the World Pride Human Rights Conference 2014. There is also one box of records for the Department of Political Science, mainly relating to awards and scholarships.

Throughout his teaching career at the University of Toronto, Prof. Rayside has been an advocate on gay, lesbian and feminist issues. His university advocacy activities are numerous. Between 1985 and 1987, he served on the Ad Hoc Committee on the Status of Women, University of Toronto. Prof. Rayside was also a Member of the Sexual Harassment Hearing Panel, University of Toronto, 1988-1992. In this capacity, he heard the first case under the new Sexual Harassment Policy, Torfason vs. Hummel. He was a founding member and coordinator of the Committee on Homophobia from 1989-1991 and remained a member until 1994. In addition, between 1989 and 1994, Prof. Rayside was a member of the Men's Forum. He also served on the Teach-In Committee and was responsible for organising a university-wide teach-in on sexism and violence against women in 1990. Prof. Rayside also participated on the Ad hoc crisis team to handle the case of a U. of T. residence student with AIDS, 1991-1992, and helped prepare a discussion of report on university AIDS policy. He also assisted in the organisation of the "Queer Sites: Studies in Lesbian and Gay Culture" Conference in 1993.

Records in this series document Prof. Rayside's advocacy activities and leadership on equity issues relating to gender and sexual orientation. Types of records include: correspondence, reports, briefs, notes, meeting minutes, programmes, and conference posters.

Committees documented in B1998-0029 are: Ad Hoc Committee on the Status of Women; Ad hoc crisis team to handle the case of a U. of T. residence student with AIDS; Men's Forum, Queer Sites Conference Organising Committee; Sexual Harassment Hearing Panel; and Teach-In Committee.

Groups or committees documented in B2008-0023 include: Committee on Homophobia, Men's Forum, Positive Space Campaign, Lesbian and Gay Academic Society, Toronto Centre for Gay and Lesbian Studies, Working Group on Policy Issues (response to homelessness) and the Equity Committee for the Canadian Federation of Humanities and Social Sciences. Other files generally document Rayside's involvement on issues of pay equity, diversity, human rights as well as gay and lesbian rights. There are two files that document the *Bent on Change* conferences in 2000 and 2002 of which Rayside was a key organizer. Finally, filed separately because of restrictions are two files documenting Rayside's legal challenges against councillor Betty Disero over election funding.

Groups or committees documented in B2013-0015 include the Bill 7 Coalition, The Body Politic, Canadian Lesbian and Gay Archives, Canadian Union of Public Employees, Community Research Initiative of Toronto, Free the Press Foundation, Committee on Homophobia, Positive Space Campaign, Right to Privacy Committee, and the Toronto Gay Community Council. There are also select files related to court cases and affidavits Prof. Rayside was involved in, or wrote, and files related to activism carried out within the University of Toronto, as well as his work related to gender issues, including the Hummel case. Files are arranged alphabetically by name of the group, organization, or person they pertain to, and in rare cases, the name of the issue they concern, if no group, organization, or person name is available. This series also contains one file of photographs and one file of artifacts.

The records in this series from B2008-0023 document Prof. Rayside's roles as both a mentor to students and colleagues, as well as his role as a peer reviewer. This series consists of letters of recommendation written for students applying to scholarships, graduate schools, and employment. The correspondence covers the period from 1974 to 1995 and is grouped alphabetically. A second set of files including born-digital files contain mainly reviews and evaluations. They include: letters of support for grant applications, awards, tenure and promotion; reader's reports for peer review journals such as the Canadian Journal of Political Science as well as reviews of monographs and articles for various publishers; evaluations for both teaching assistants and Ph.D. students; and comments and evaluation for proposed research projects by peers.

The records in this series from B2013-0015 contain material documenting his academic staffing and promotions recommendations, his grant reviews, letters of recommendation he has written for students, research assessments, and research reviews as well as person or publication-specific files. These files are grouped in the above mentioned order and arranged chronologically within each group. The files consist of correspondence, notes, reader's reports, and application documents.

## Series 8      Papers, Articles and Reviews

The records in this series from B2008-0023 document many articles and papers published by Rayside from 1977 to 2002. The topics range from his early interest and research on federalism and small towns to his extensive research on gay rights and gender equality for which he is now so well known. Arranged chronologically, most files contain correspondence and draft typescripts and some also contain research notes and reader's comments. There are also some interview transcripts and notes for Prof. Rayside's article "Gay Rights and Family Values: The Passage of Bill 7 in Ontario" (1987) as well as for a series of articles written in the early 1990s on AIDS in Canada with Evert Lindquist. Most published reviews written by Rayside from 1979 to 1994 are amassed in one folder. Note that many records in this series are born-digital. Also included are cassette recordings of some of his talks and public appearances.

Records from B2013-0015 document Rayside's published peer-reviewed articles, chapters in books, encyclopedia entries, magazine and newspaper articles and reviews. Topics for these records focus mainly on gay rights and gender equity. Sub-topics include marriage, parenting and workplace safety. Files are arranged by type of publication, and then chronologically within each type, with the exception of encyclopedia entries which are alphabetical by name of the encyclopedia. Types of records include notes, drafts, correspondence and reader's comments.

Records from B2017-0024 includes assessments done by Rayside for refereed papers 2013-2017. There are also drafts for papers *Employment Equity* written with Gerry Hunt and *The Inadequate Recognition of Sexual Diversity* published in the Journal of Canadian Studies. Records also document his contributions to two books *Queering Ontario* (UBC Press, 2012 ?) and *After Marriage Equality: the Future of LGBT Rights* (NYU Press 2015) Finally there are two files relating to his contribution to Who's Who in Gay and Lesbian History (Sidney's Biographies), 1999-2006.

B2008-0023 consists almost entirely of born-digital files arranged by course number. Most folders contain, course syllabus giving outlines, bibliography, tests, assignments. There is also related correspondence and memos. Only Course Pol 103 contains original lectures. It also contains one box of textual records relating to Pol 315 which does contain original lecture notes as well as documents relating to the course's development. Also included is one file of notes for a course Rayside took in 1977 with C.B. MacPherson - Pol. 200. Taking such a course as a new professor was preparatory to his teaching role.

B2013-0015 contains almost exclusively original lecture notes, with some syllabi and handouts, for the courses listed below. Files are arranged by course code in ascending order.
