Vol. 1 Deals chiefly with Dempster's finances, purchase of the Skibo estate, improvements, income from rental. Correspondents include: Lauchlian Maclean, WM. Ramsay, Sir Adam Ferguson, James Guthrie, John Fraser and of course Dempster himself.

Dempster on the economic prospects of Skibo, and of Dundee and Perth. Sir John Sinclair's offer to buy Skibo for 18,000.

Dempster to Captain Dempster on the possiblity of properity in the Highlands, and on his building up of the estate.

George Mackintosh on the spinning "Jeany".

David Dale on the introduction of manufactures into Galloway and on Sinclair's plan for a road to aid manufacturing plans for Sutherland.

Dr. Black, chemist, on analysis of limestone from Sutherland and ways of refining it.

Family letters.

3 Letter from Lord Gower (later Lord Sutherland) re raising an army in Switzerland, and Dempster's reply.

George Mackintosh re the company they have set up at Spinningdale, the putting up of a 20 loom shop and mills, the need to raise capital. G. Dempster discusses the Spinningdale project, bad trade propects, farming.

G.D. to Captain Dempster, giving detailed account of the dividends from the estate and G.D.'s personal expenses.

Letter from Mackintosh hoping that Spinningdale will not fold. He has sent spinners and weavers from Glasgow to Spinningdale to enlighten "the poor ignorant natives in the County".

Many other letters about trade and shipping as well as personal letters. Most interesting is Observations on want of silver, 1795, by G.D. which deals with the rate of wages for agricultural workers and the need for banks.

Letters re prices of cattle & horses; crops & fertilizers; farm cottages being built for the men; planting of 206,000 fir trees, etc. 35454 A letter re the Spinningdale venture.

Draft of a proposal for raising a fund by voluntary subscription for ascertaining the extent and the value of the coal lately discovered in the Co. of Sutherland.

Draft of a plan for employing 20 acres of land, 1796.\* Detailed Vol. 4 letter from William Forbes of Pitsligo re the death of James Boswell, (cont'd) and telling Dempster of the improvements he, Forbes, has brought about in New Pitsligo. Group of family letters re death of Captain Dempster, and of George Dempster, the nephew, and the inheriting of the estate by a niece (Mrs. Soper, later Soper Dempster).

General

Legal complications over the estate, and the changing of Mr. Soper's name to Soper Dempster. Interesting and important correspondence with 35456 Thomas Telford re the improvements of the Highlands by means of roads, canals, and bridges.
