BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

John Emerson Langdon was born in Ottawa, April 13, 1902. In 1928 he was appointed Editor for eastern Canada for the Financial Post, based in Montreal. He began visiting antique stores while buying items for his new home and started to notice that a silver hallmark attributed to a Channel Islands silversmith had been used extensively in Canada. This led him to do research on the topic, and he eventually became a leading authority in the field. He left the Financial Post in 1945 to accept a position with McLeod, Young and Weir, investment dealers in Toronto. At the time of his retirement in 1967, he was a vice-president and director, and head of the firm's underwriting activities.

His books are: Clock and watchmakers and allied workers in Canada, 1700-1900, Toronto: 1976; Loyalist silversmiths in British North America, 1776-1800, Toronto: 1970; Guide to marks on early Canadian silver: 18th and 19th centuries, Toronto: 1968; Canadian silversmiths, 1700-1900, Toronto: 1966; and Early Canadian silversmiths and their marks, Lunenburg, Vt: [1960].
