# Biographical Sketch

John Robert Evans was born in Toronto on 1 October 1929. He attended the University of Toronto Schools from 1939 to 1946 and then studied medicine at the University of Toronto, from which he graduated with an MD in 1952. Awarded the Rhodes Scholarship for Ontario in 1952, he went to Oxford University where he earned his D.Phil in 1955. Between 1955 and 1961 he did post-graduate training and research in internal medicine and cardiology in London, England, Toronto and at Harvard University. In 1958 he became a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Canada and in 1960 a Fellow of the American College of Physicians.

From 1961 to 1965 he was an associate in the Department of Medicine in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Toronto and a physician at the Toronto General Hospital. In 1965, at the age of 35, he was appointed founding dean of the Faculty of Medicine at McMaster University and Vice-President (Health Sciences). "His recruitment efforts produced a stellar cast of educators who moved the school immediately into the vanguard of advanced medical education and the effective application of clinical epidemiology. Under his leadership, the new school was fertile ground for pioneering work in patient-centred curriculum and innovative problem-based learning, a cumulative integrated, progressive, consistent strategy now refined and used in the world's most prestigious medical schools."1

In 1972 Dr. Evans left McMaster to succeed Claude Bissell as President of the University of Toronto, a position he held until 1978. His tenure occurred during a time of increasing financial restraint and began with the report of the Commission on Post-Secondary Education in Ontario, to which he responded with his own predictions, "naming public accountability and participation in civil society as issues that would mark the future of public higher education." In 1978 he stood as the Liberal candidate in a federal by-election in Rosedale in Toronto but was defeated by David Crombie.

Dr. Evans work had already attracted international attention, and in 1979 he was commissioned by the Rockefeller Foundation to head its Commission on the Future of Schools of Public Health, for which he produced an international study of public health and population-based medicine. This led, a few months later, to his joining the World Bank as founding director of its Population, Health and Nutrition Department. Over the course of the next four years, he was "instrumental in introducing broader concepts in health determinants, setting a direction that lead to fundamental contributions to health programs in underdeveloped countries and hearteningly notable changes in infant mortality."<sup>3</sup> In 1982 Dr. Evans joined the board of the Rockefeller Foundation and served as its chair from 1987 to 1995, the first Canadian to do so.

In 1983 Dr. Evans joined Allelix Biopharmaceuticals Inc. of Mississauga, Ontario, as chair and CEO, a position he held until 1990. As such, he established Canada's first biotechnology company, creating a model for the country's biotechnology industry. Since 2000 he has been vice-chair of NPS-Allelix Biopharmaceuticals. He has also served as chairman of the board of Torstar (1993-2005), and chairman of the board of Alcan Aluminium Ltd. (1996-2002). In 1997 he was appointed the first chair of the Canadian Foundation for Innovation, an independent corporation established by the Government of Canada. He was a moving force behind the creation of the Medical and Related Science Research District in Toronto (MaRS) and is its first chair (from 2000). From 2003 to 2005 he chaired the Ontario Cancer Research Network, and from 2005 has been chair of the Ontario Institute for Cancer Research (OICR). From 1990 to 2000 he was chair of the Walter and Duncan Gordon Charitable Foundation. Dr. Evans is, one of his colleagues has argued, "the most connected person in Canada."

Dr. Evans expertise has been widely sought in the fields of medicine and public health. He has chaired the National Biotechnology Advisory Committee of Canada, the Ontario Premier's Health Review Panel, the International Commission on Health Research for Development (1997-1998), the African Medical Research Foundation – Canada, and the Pew Charitable Trusts Program Advisory Committees on International Health Policy and Global Stewardship Initiatives (1988-1994). He was a member of the Council for the Institute of Medicine of the United States National Academy of Science, the World Health Organization's Advisory Committee on Medical Research, and the federal Pepin-Robarts Commission on National Unity. He was a member of the Hospital for Sick Children's Foundation and the Alberta Premier's Council on Health. He served on the board of MDS from 1989 to 2005.

Dr. Evans has been the recipient of many honours. These include several honorary degrees from Canadian universities (for example, LLD, University of Toronto 1980; LLD, University of Calgary 1996), Yale University, Johns Hopkins University and Universiteit Maastricht. He was also elected Honorary Fellow of University College, Oxford, the London School of Hygiene and the Royal College of Physicians (London). In 1978 he was named a Companion of the Order of Canada and to the Order of Ontario in 1991. The following year the Gardner Foundation gave him its Wightman Award and in 2000 he was inducted into the Canadian Medical Hall of Fame. In 2001 he and his wife, Gay Glassco, were jointly honoured by the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews. In 2002 he received the F.N.G. Starr Award from the Canadian Medical Association and was honoured when the John R. Evans Chair in Health Sciences Educational Research was established at McMaster University. In 2005 he was inducted into the Canadian Business Hall of Fame and in 2007 he was awarded the Henry G. Friesen International Prize in Health Research.

Also includes accounts of trips to China and Japan, and files on several conferences.

This series includes some personal correspondence including many congratulatory letters when Evans was appointed President of the University of Toronto. There is one box of documents that Evan himself pulled together for a possible autobiography. Accompanying these are his notes on various aspects of his career. This series includes documentation including certificates, diplomas, plaque and medals for his many awards and recognitions. Finally, cassette tapes of interviews Dr. Evans did on radio programs including "Voice of the Pioneer and CBC Morningside.

## Series 2: Professional activities

1957-2012 1.84 m

This series documents Dr. Evans' professional involvement, often as chair or a member of the board of directors, of many of the organizations noted in his biographical sketch (and some that are not). Organizations such as the Rockefeller Foundation, where the bulk of the files obviously remain in the head offices, are still documented sufficiently to provide an overview of Dr. Evans involvement. A few organizations – the African Medical Research Foundation-Canada, the Commonwealth Fund, and Vartana, for example – have little documentation (the last because it is so new). Most organizations fall in between and for two, the Canadian Foundation for Innovation and the Medical and Related Science Research District (MaRS), the files are so extensive that each rates its own series (see Series 3 and 4).

The files contain correspondence, memoranda, minutes of meetings, reports and associated background material. Dr. Evans made extensive handwritten notes and many of his memoranda are scattered throughout the files, along with annotated material he was working with. The arrangement is alphabetical by the name of the organization.

### Series 2: Professional activities (continued)

Dr. Evans was frequently approached as new initiatives were started in the fields of medicine, education and related social policy. One of these was the Boreal Institute, a charity founded in 2004 that focuses on contributing to economic and social development, internationally and in Canada by serving as an enabler and capacity builder for civil society. By the end of the year he had arranged for seed funding for the Institute and had attracted a number of influential backers such as Joseph Rotman. In 1998 Dr. Evans became involved in an ongoing reassessment of the role of the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA), a review that included, over the next three years, a series of discussions and meetings at the highest level, including Prime Minister Chrétien's office. Another project was the Cancer Research Institute of Ontario, founded in 2003. It immediately won the support of MaRS and its chair, Dr. Evans, who also was selected chair of the Institute in 2005. The single file in this series documents the work of its Ad Hoc Advisory Group. In 1995 Dr. Evans' served on a panel that assessed the work of the Essential National Health Research concept as carried out by the Council on Health Research for Development, based in Geneva. He was also a member of the Hospital for Sick Children Foundation. The principal file here relates to the Apotex/Nancy Oliveri controversy.

Dr. Evans has been closely associated with the Pew Charitable Foundation, the Rockefeller Foundation and the World Bank which, collectively, supported a United Nations initiative, the International Health Policy Program. The files document his involvement with the program from 1994 to 1996. Another organization with close links to the Pew Charitable Foundation is the John E. Fetzer Institute, Inc. of Kalamazoo, Michigan that, in 1995, hired Dr. Evans as a consultant to assist in planning and implementing its program. This he did, partly through chairing its advisory committee on frontier medicine, on which he kept detailed files.

The project that established Dr. Evans' reputation at the international level was his innovative work as founding dean of the Faculty of Medicine at McMaster University and, in particular, the construction of its innovative Health Sciences Centre. Most of the records pertaining to his deanship and the Centre project are, understandably, at McMaster University, but this series contains Dr. Evans' copy of its original program, with accompanying planning reports and some photographs. There is also an oral history interview with him on the beginning of the faculty, with accompanying photographs, and two later files on other administrative matters.

In 2004 Dr. Evans was invited by the Premier of Ontario to chair a new body, the Minister's Commercialization Advisory Council, the inaugural meeting of which was held in January 2005 and which continued throughout the year. Following these files are two others, one each on the Ontario Cancer Research Network, which he chaired from 2003 to 2005 and on the Ontario Research Council. There are no files on the Ontario Institute for Cancer Research of which Evans became chair in 2005.

### Series 2: Professional activities (continued)

The Pew Charitable Trusts funds a wide variety of research projects, two of which are documented in this series. In 1993 the Pew Center for Civic Journalism, launched a project called "Renewing our democratic heart" and invited Dr. Evans to become a member of its board of directors. Meetings held throughout 1993 and 1994 are documented here. He also agreed to chair the advisory board for the Pew Global Stewardship Initiative which studied American population policy, consumption patterns, and stewardship in relation to the formation of policy nationally and internationally. The files run through to mid-1996 and also document the contribution of Thomas Homer-Dixon of the University of Toronto.

Dr. Evans' formal association with the Rockefeller Foundation began in 1979 when it asked him to head its Commission on the Future of Schools of Public Health, for which he produced an international study of public health and population-based medicine, 'Measure and management in medicine and health services'. The work on this project extended to late 1981, even though he left the Foundation after several months for the World Bank. The files contain correspondence and meetings related to his study, along with his working files. There is also one unidentified notebook of notes on meeting(s) Dr. Evans attended, with a photo of attendees at one of the Bellagio conferences (see also Series 5). He joined the Foundation's board of directors in 1982 and served as its chair from 1987 to 1995, the first Canadian to do so, and has maintained a close association with the Foundation. The single file from the period of his chairmanship documents his Foundation funded visit to Myanmar in November 1994 as UNICEF external advisor on health research and management for child survival and development.

In Toronto, Dr. Evans was a member of the steering committee of the Toronto City Summit Alliance, a coalition of civil leaders in the Toronto region. It met with officials, from the premier down, produced an action report and supported a number of initiatives to strengthen community service. It worked closely with the Toronto Region Research Alliance and other organizations such as MaRS. The files date from late 2003.

There are a few files on the University of Toronto: on the teaching of the cardiovascular programme in the Faculty of Medicine (1970), on an International Health meeting hosted by the Department of Medicine in 1998, on strategic planning for the Department of Surgery (2004), and on the Rotman School of Management (2002). Next is a single file on a board of directors meeting in June 2005 of Vartana, a charity with a mandate to develop Canada's first financial institution dedicated to meeting the needs of voluntary sector organizations.

When Dr. Evans joined the World Bank in 1979, it was the beginning of a long relationship that often included the Rockefeller Foundation. The earliest files document his work with the Population, Health and Nutrition Department, which he founded, but most relate to his work from 1995 to 1997 with the Ad Hoc World Bank/Rockefeller Orphan Drug and Vaccine Project relating to the development, licensing and supply of AIDS vaccines to the under-developed world. The files contain detailed correspondence, notes, memoranda, minutes, and reports with government and corporate bodies.

The last files in this series document Dr. Evans' work with the World Health Organization on two projects. The first was its Executive Board organizational study on "The role of WHO in training in public health and health programme management" (1981), followed by its Ad Hoc Review on Health Research in 1995-1996. The files contain notes, minutes, addresses, reports, and background material.

### Series 3: Canadian Foundation for Innovation

1997-2010, 0.8 m

In 1997 Dr. Evans was appointed first chair of the Canadian Foundation for Innovation, an independent corporation established by the Government of Canada for facilitate research.

The files on the activities of the Board of Directors include correspondence, minutes of meetings, files on consultants, financial services, legal and tax issues, and other activities such as conferences and surveys. These are followed by files on the Audit and Finance Committee and the Governance and Nominating Committee. Most of the remaining files focus on the death of president and Chief executive officer Keith Brimacombe and the search for and selection of his successor, David Strangway.

The arrangement is largely chronological within each level of office holder.

## Series 4: MaRS (Medical and Related Science Research District)

2000-2010 1.43 m.

Three years after assuming the chair of the Canadian Foundation for Innovation, Dr. Evans became a moving force behind the creation of the Medical and Related Science Research District (MaRS) in Toronto.

The series begins with files on the creation of MaRS (initially Toronto Biotechnology Commercialization Centre), followed by meetings (board, planning, marketing, etc.) and associated correspondence, notes and reports, including corporate presentations, arranged chronologically. The volume of correspondence increases from mid-2003 and one of the meetings documented in detail is with the Minster of Health. Reproductions of photographs are incorporated into some of the reports and presentations.

# Series 5: Conferences and workshops

1979-2007 0.24 m

This series documents a number of conferences and workshops with which Dr. Evans was associated. The files contain correspondence, notes, memoranda, minutes, and programs and supporting documents. The arrangement is alphabetical by name of the event.

The series begins with a file on the Association of Canadian Medical Colleges 'Trilateral 2000' conference. Next are conferences held at the Bellagio Study and Conference Centre, Lake Como, Italy in 1979 ('Health and population in developing countries') and 1995 ('Seeking a new paradigm for sustainable human development'), of which the Rockefeller Foundation was a sponsor. In 1995 Dr. Evans was invited by the board of directors of the Commonwealth Fund in New York City to join their retreat, where he gave an address, 'Implications of turn-of-the-century addresses for foundations'. There is also a file on a workshop held in Montebello, Quebec in June 1999, where ideas and concepts generated produced a report, 'The future of global and regional integration'.

### Series 5: Conferences and workshops (continued)

Dr. Evans has long been interested in issues relating to governance in the corporate sector. This is reflected, in particular, in files on three different organizations, the Director's College at McMaster University, the National Association of Corporate Directors, and the ICD Corporate Governance College module held at the Rotman School of Management at the University of Toronto in 2004.

There are also files on the National Forum on Canada's International Relations (1994) where Dr. Evans was praised for "the strong leadership you gave to your group". Next is a file on the Ontario Medical Association conference, 'Ensuring a healthy future for Canadians: a dialogue on the Canada Health Act,' held in Toronto in May 1999. The series concludes with files on the first two Symposiums on Public Health held in Montreal in 1992 and 1994. The theme of the latter was the socio-political and moral aspects of positive health and Dr. Evans gave an address, 'Renewing community: a critical dimension of local and global stewardship' (see Series 6).

# Series 7: Speeches, Talks, Addresses

1964-2010, 2.83 m.

Dr. Evans' ideas have been disseminated most widely, through the many addresses he has been invited to deliver locally, nationally and internationally. It is here that his genius for analysis, organization and foresight and his breadth of vision and his humanity become most apparent. The addresses range over four decades of professional experience, including many to students, but also encompass tributes to family, friends, and colleagues who have meant so much to him over the years and to religious and social organizations.

There are a few small gaps of up to three or four months in some years, and only one address each for 1972 and 1973. These two are the beginning of a substantial gap that extends to 1989. From 1972 to 1978 Dr. Evans was president of the University of Toronto and speeches given then are located elsewhere in the University of Toronto Archives, primarily in A1979-0042 and A1983-0049. The latter accession also includes some of his addresses while Dean of Medicine at McMaster University. That still leaves, however, a decade of missing addresses.

The files contain correspondence, research files, notes, programs, drafts of addresses (some of which were eventually published – see Series 7). The arrangement is chronological by date of address.
