## BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

William Oelschlager, born in Schleswig-Holstein, may have emigrated first to Pennsylvania where he met and married Catherine Schmidt of Lancaster, Pennsylvania. By the early 1860's he was living in Canada, for by 1862 he was a Justice of the Peace. In Lovell's Province of Ontario Directory for 1871 he is listed as the proprietor or manager of a "tobacco factory" in Berlin, Ontario. Later he was manager of the Economical Mutual Fire Insurance Company of Berlin. 1879 until his death he served as town treasurer. In 1881 he escorted four invited German "delegates" to Manitoba to study its potential for agricultural settlement. He reported on this to John H. Pope, the Canadian Minister of Agriculture. He travelled to Europe in 1890 visiting France, Switzerland, Germany, Austria, and England. He died in Berlin, Ontario in 1893.
