### G.M.A. AND GWENYTH D. GRUBE FONDS

Dates of Creation: 1890 – 2011, predominant 1905-1970

**Extent:** 5.5 m of textual records approximately 1,425 photographs

### **Biographical Sketches**

**Georges Maximilien Antoine Grube**, classicist, Trinity College professor, and active member in the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation (CCF) and New Democratic Party (NDP), was born in Antwerp, Belgium, on 3 August 1899, the son of Antoine and Marie Reiners. At the beginning of the Great War in 1914 he emigrated to England where he attended King Edward's High School, Birmingham. He served briefly with the Belgian army towards the end of the war and after the cessation of hostilities he acted as an interpreter to British forces in Belgium. He completed his education at Emmanuel College, Cambridge, where he graduated with a B.A. in classics in 1922 and an M.A. in 1925. It is perhaps by this time that he started generally using the name George Maximilian Antony Grube. He became a naturalized British subject on 25 January 1924, and on 7 August he married in London Gwenyth Deen Macintosh, a fellow graduate in classics at Cambridge.

After four years as a lecturer at the University College of Swansea, Wales, George Grube came to Toronto in 1928 to take the position of Professor of Classics at Trinity College. He acted as head of the Department of Classics at Trinity College from 1932 to 1965 and as head of the Graduate Department of Classics at the University of Toronto from 1951 to 1966. He retired from Trinity College in 1968, but was re-appointed as a special lecturer during 1968-69 and became emeritus professor of classics in 1969.

As a classical scholar, G.M.A. Grube is best known as author of *Plato's Thought* (1935), *The Drama of Euripedes* (1941), *A Greek Critic: Demetrius on Style* (1961), and *The Greek and Roman Critics* (1965), and as translator of Plato's *The Republic* (1974), a work that continues to be widely used. He published over 30 articles in various scholarly journals. A founding member of the League for Social Reconstruction, he served as president of the Toronto branch in 1934-35, and he was managing editor of the *Canadian Forum* from 1937 to 1941. His interest in both cultural and political affairs found further scope in writing political pamphlets and in making frequent contributions to the *Canadian Forum* and the *New Commonwealth*. He was also a member of the Toronto Labour Council and of the Civil Liberties Association of Toronto.

Grube became a member of the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation in 1934; he was elected as the first Ontario vice-president and served as president in the

1940s, was a member of the C.C.F. National Council, and president of the C.C.F. in Ontario. He was elected to serve as trustee for Ward 1 to the Toronto Board of Education in 1942 and 1943. He was the C.C.F. candidate in the riding of Toronto Broadview in the general elections of 1940, 1945, and 1950, but was not successful. In 1961 he was co-chairman of the founding convention of the N.D.P. He wrote numerous articles and pamphlets on the C.C.F. and the N.D.P.

Grube was elected a fellow of the Royal Society of Canada in 1951. His book, *The Greek and Roman Critics*, was winner of the American Philological Association's Award of Merit in 1965. After his retirement he was honoured with a festschrift, "Studies Presented to G.M.A. Grube on the Occasion of His Seventieth Birthday," published in *Phoenix* in spring 1969. In 1973 he was awarded an honorary degree by the University of Victoria and in 1977 was awarded the Canada Coronation Medal. G.M.A. Grube died in Toronto on 13 December 1982.

**Gwenyth Deen Macintosh Grube**, classicist, teacher, and active member in the C.C.F. and N.D.P., was born 24 September 1900 in London, England. In 1919 she entered Girton College, University of Cambridge, where she gained Part I of the Classical Tripos in 1921 and Part II in 1922 and received an M.A. degree in Classics. She continued her studies in 1922, doing postgraduate work at Bryn Mawr in Pennsylvania. Gwenyth Macintosh met George Grube at Cambridge, and after their marriage in 1924 she taught Latin and Greek at Bedales, a co-educational boarding school in Hampshire. She came to Canada in 1928 when her husband was appointed a professor at Trinity College. Gwenyth Grube returned to England for the period 1932 to 1934 with her two children in order to teach at Dartington Hall, a progressive school in Totnes, Devon.

A supporter of the Labour Party in England since her college days, Gwenyth Grube joined the C.C.F. in 1934. In the 1950s she was a member of the Ontario C.C.F. Provincial Executive. She ran unsuccessfully in 1945 for election as trustee of the Toronto Board of Education in Ward I, a post her husband had held previously. She was the C.C.F. candidate for the riding of Eglinton in the federal election of 1957. She was always particularly interested in educational and welfare issues, and a number of her articles were published in various journals. After her children were adults, she was a part-time teacher at the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto in the 1950s. Along with Agnes Macphail she was an active member of the board of the Elizabeth Fry Society. Gwenyth Grube died in Toronto on 24 March 1987.

George and Gwenyth Grube had three children: Antonia (Toni) Joan (m. Swalgren), born in England in 1927, John Deen (1930-2008), born in Toronto, and Jennifer Julia (m. Podlecki), born in Toronto in 1935.

### **Scope and Content**

The fonds documents George Grube's early life and family in Belgium and England, education at Emmanuel College at Cambridge, professorship at Trinity College, activities in the League for Social Reconstruction, C.C.F. and N.D.P., academic and political editing and publishing career, and family life in Canada. The fonds also documents Gwenyth's early life, teaching career, political activities in the C.C.F. and N.D.P., and family life in Canada. Records include correspondence with personal friends, professional colleagues, associates, and publishers; legal, academic, military and financial documents; publications such as books, articles, reviews, galleys, offprints, posters and pamphlets; manuscripts, notes, drafts, subject files, meeting minutes, and newspaper clippings.

## SERIES 1: G. M. A. Grube Correspondence

**Dates of creation:** 1914 - 1984

Extent: 10 cm of textual records

### Scope and content:

This series consists of professional and personal correspondence between G. M. A. Grube and family, friends, colleagues, contemporaries, and organizations. A dedicated and prolific correspondent, he exchanged letters with family in Belgium when he emigrated to England, particularly with his Aunt Berthe Reiners and sister Lucie. Included in this series is a Correspondence Militaire he sent from Sarthe, France, to his aunt in 1918 when he was on active service during the First World War. Later he exchanged letters with English friends Ethel and Harrison Barrow who appear to have helped him after his move to England.

There is also professional correspondence with Trinity College Provost Seeley regarding responsibilities as a professor at Trinity College and routine college business. There are letters from colleagues at other universities such as the University of California at Berkeley, Johns Hopkins, and Princeton regarding professional opportunities including speaking engagements. Finally, he exchanged letters with fellow scholars around the world from the late 1920s to the 1970s, to discuss current scholarship in his field, and his own writings. Correspondents include E. R. Dodds, A. E. Taylor, Gilbert Norwood, Philip W. Harsh, and Walter L. Owen.

**Extent:** 8 cm of textual records

### Scope and content:

This series consists primarily of correspondence between Gwenyth (née Macintosh) and her mother Annie Harriett Macintosh (née Gray) in England, her daughter Jennifer Podlecki, and granddaughter Juli Podlecki. There are some letters addressed to both Gwenyth and G. M. A. There is also information regarding family friends Harrison and Ethel Barrow as well as a few letters and information on John Rekai. Finally there are letters to and from John Grube as well as documents related to him.

# **SERIES 3: Academic Publications**

Dates of creation: [1936?] - 1981

**Extent:** 80 cm of textual records

Scope and content:

This series consists of G. M. A. Grube's published works including books, articles, and reviews of other works, mostly pertaining to his professional life in academia. It also includes related material, such as drafts, holograph copies, typescripts, galleys, translations, and notes. Book length material G. M. A. worked on includes plays by Aristophanes (unpublished), *The Drama of Euripides*, first published in 1941, *The Greek and Roman Critics*, first published in 1965, and works by Plato including *The Republic*, first published in 1974, *Trial and Death of Socrates*, including the dialogues *Euthyphro, Apology, Crito,* and *Phaedo*, first published in 1975, and *Meno* first published in 1976. The manuscript, "Aristophanic Comedy" went through the editing process yet never found a publisher or distributor.

Series also contains correspondence between Grube and publishing houses, including Hackett especially regarding his publication of *The Republic*. Also includes reader's suggestions and personal as well as professional letters exchanged with William and Frances Hackett. At the end are reviews of Grube's books. The files are arranged chronologically.

### Notes:

#### Dates of originals:

Manuscripts are generally undated. They were were given a 5 year date range, based on the estimated length of time between first and final stages of writing and publishing.

### Scope and content:

This series consists of subject files, arranged alphabetically, with related correspondence on topics that were of interest to G. M. A. Grube. Topics seem to focus primarily on secondary education and include debates around academic freedom, higher education in Canada, Thesaurus Linguae Gracae, and reports of the Trinity College Council. There is also a file of newspaper clippings about the Hepburn Controversy which took place in 1939 while Grube was a professor at Trinity College. At a C.C.F. convention Grube openly criticized the Canadian defense budget, purportedly stating that it would be a "waste of public funds" if the money went to military expenses rather than towards social services; he also supposedly criticized the budget as being in support of British interests instead of Canadian. This resulted in a storm of counter criticism, led by Ontario Premier Mitch Hepburn, upon Grube and fellow professor Frank Underhill of University College. The controversy snowballed into an issue of freedom of speech and eventually was resolved. Series is arranged alphabetically.

There are quite a few unidentified individuals who were likely familial relations of G. M. A. Grube or friends of his family. Photos were taken in England, Belgium, Canada, and Egypt.

**Note:** Some confusion and discrepancies occur with identifications. Some photographs contain multiple names attributed to the same person; this occurs particularly when there are multiple copies of the same photo. A partial family tree is in the Administration file for this fonds.
