Biographical Sketch:

Stanley Morisse (Stylianos Moraitis) was born in Cyprus on June 11th, 1897 to parents Georgios Moraitis (a tailor) and Rebecka Saporilla (a teacher). Morisse's father died at a young age and his mother never remarried. She worked at a school for girls in Adalya, Cyprus.

In 1912 Morisse graduated from school and went to work as an apprentice in a tailor shop, a trade that he would continue for the rest of his life. Morisse was pleased to obtain a British passport when the British annexed Cyprus in 1914 because it allowed him more freedom to travel. Morisse boarded a boat for Egypt in 1915 with the intentions of continuing to Russia, but remained in Egypt, where he spent any extra money he had to learn French. He then worked for a French shipping company called "Messagerie Maritimes." In 1918 Morisse joined the merchant navy as a cook, where he learned English and traveled to Australia and India. Eventually Morisse made his way to Australia to live for awhile. Morisse was naturalized to the Commonwealth of Australia under the name Stelios Morisse at twenty-six years of age in 1927. This is where he first becomes involved in communism and is one of the founding members of the communist party in Sydney. Morisse immigrated to Canada aboard The Empress of Canada in 1928 and became a Canadian citizen in 1953. According to various information found within his collection, after settling in North America, Morisse resided in Seattle with his brother in Tasso, Washington; Hamilton, Ontario; Victoria, Vancouver and Coquitlam, British Columbia. While there is little documentation concerning his immediate family, there are hundreds of photographs within his collection featuring him with family members and acquaintances. There are also postcards written by various family members.

Morisse was a tailor by profession, and received a Diploma of Merit in 1920 from the Minister's Cutting Academy of London West. While residing in Hamilton, he worked for Firth Bros, Limited as a pocket maker for over 10 years.

Morisse was an active member of the Communist Party of Canada, and his collection includes correspondence with Sam Lawrence (former mayor of Hamilton and representative of the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation in the Ontario legislature),

Sidney Smith (leading member of the Communist Party of Canada), and Tim Buck (long time leader of the Communist Party of Canada) on matters regarding the unionization of workers.

Excerpts of a letter written by Tim Buck [September 30, 1954].

Comrade Stanley Morisse worked consistently with the Communist Party of Canada for several years in the struggle to unionize the men's clothing industry in Hamilton. He was a leading activist in the Amalgamated Clothing Workers' Union in Hamilton. He joined the Communist Party of Canada during the internal struggle provoked by the attempt of part of the old leadership to smuggle Trotskyite ideology and support of the pretence of American Exceptionalism to the Party.

Aside from his membership in the Communist Party of Canada, Stanley had an active political life that was spent writing to an assortment of people concerning different political issues (principally concerning Communism issues worldwide, and Cyprus). A lot of his political action was executed by sending letters and writing publications for various government offices, departments and ministries. Some of the letters and publications were written while he held the position of President at the Greek Democratic Centre in Victoria. Included in the collection are letters from William Lyon Mackenzie King, Lester B. Pearson, Archbishop Makarios Nikosia (former President of the Republic of Cyprus) and Stavros Stavrianos, a distinguished Greek-Canadian world historian. Morisse also donated various sums of money to many groups: University of Victoria, Royal Jubilee Hospital (Victoria), an Athenian Communist newspaper (He Auge), a Cypriot Communist newspaper (Charauge), A.K.E.L (The Progressive Party of Working People), Rizopastis (The Official Newspaper of the Communist Party of Greece), The Political Coalition E.A.M., The American Relief for Greek Democracy, Inc. Publications were sent to: Victoria Public Library Royal Commonwealth Society (London), Our Generation: A Quarterly Journal, the National Library of Canada, the Provincial Library of British Columbia, and the majority of offices, departments and ministries of the Canadian government in 1944.

Various highlighted items in his collection include many interesting photographs documenting the May Day Rallies of 1933-4 in Hamilton, Ontario- suggesting that he had an active role in organizing these demonstrations. There are also a number of newspaper clippings (primarily from The Daily Colonist (Victoria, B.C.), documenting such issues as communism, the war in Vietnam, Cyprus, various actions taken by the Canadian Government, and celebrities such as Marilyn Munroe and Princess Diana. A series of postcards document a trip taken by Sam Lawrence across Europe in 1936. Also featured is a collection of photographs of Lenin from 1897-1917 from a book of photographs entitled "Lenin" edited by Vladimir Il'ich and a collection of postcards documenting the Third Congress of Komintern in Russia, 1919. Lastly, there are two typescript books dedicated to Morisse and written by Georgoula Beikos entitled "The Greece That Fights: A Collection of Articles in Russian", and a book of poems written by political prisoners on the Cypriot island of Gioura after the Greek civil war from 1945-1949.
